LITERACY and READING This term, we will be on our fourth book study: Pig Heart Boy by Malorie Blackman. We will be continuing to build upon key writing skills developed in previous terms. Children will learn: to consistently write to meet and extend the year 6 objectives, using correct grammar and punctuation and an array of sentence structures to convey information accurately. We will be covering fractions in all four operations ,percentages ,decimals, geometry ,area, volume and ratio.
