

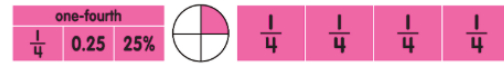
English

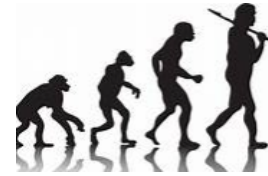
Maths

This term, we will be learning about fractions, percentages and decimals. As well as learning how to convert between them.



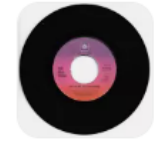
Science

PSHE

Our topic this term is Staying Safe. The children will learn about road safety and the essential life skill of basic first aid, including how to deal with minor burns.

RE

Children will be exploring Christianity, looking at the idea "Is anything really eternal?"

Reading

We will read the non-fiction text, The History of African and Caribbean Communities in Britain. We will recap the features of non-fiction books and use these when answering questions. Later in the term, we explore poetry and compare poems such as "Mother to Son" by Langston Hughes and "The Caged Bird" by Maya Angelou.

Geography

Our focus topic this half term is Geography, where we will be studying Mountains. We start the spring term with a comparison study of the Canadian Rocky Mountains and the Scottish Highlands. The children will develop further map skills and compare both physical and human features. We will also construct 3D topographical maps.



Art

The children will be studying the unit "Urban Landscape." They will be learning to use tone to present depth, light, and shadow, and will also be using perspective when drawing. They will learn to use and purposefully combine multiple drawing media (e.g., pencil, pen and ink) and to experiment with creating drawings on different materials.

Computing

During our computing lessons, the children will be channelling their business aspirations and learning to select, collect and analyse data to help draw clear conclusions. They will use the filtering and sorting skills they learnt in year 5 to apply them to the data they have collected to answer a question.
