



# Pupil Premium 2016-17



The Pupil Premium is a grant given to schools improve the co-educational outcome and life chances for pupils who receive free school meals, children in care and children of service families.

Geoffrey Field Junior School has a significant number of pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium grant and for several years has had a coherent and successful strategy for these pupils. Between 2003 and 2011 this was funded through the governments Excellence in Cluster programme and now through the Pupil Premium.
